  - c. Question #1 RFP Page 4, Item Q states, "The vendor should provide a fax machine and or computer system or token to facilitate the confidential nature of medical information and the timeliness of prescription orders."

Can additional details be provided regarding this requirement specific to tokens with relation to the use of CorEMR for order transmission to the pharmacy?

Answer: The token is used for faxing controlled substances.

d. Question #2 - RFP Page 4, Item R states, "ability to provide CPU friendly Medical Carts." Can you please provide the current make and model of medication carts in use at ACRJ? Are current carts owned by ACRJ or provided on loan by current pharmacy vendor?

Answer: They are made by CapsaHealthcare no model numbers but serial number is 126428 and 126431. Initially given to loaner they've been since purchased outright.

e. Question #3 - RFP Page 4, Item 4.C.A states, "Vendor must install Battery Operated Delivery carts (two)" Can the model, make, and picture be provided of the current battery operated delivery carts to provide Offerors with a point of reference regarding this requirement?

f. Question #4 - RFP Page 4, Item 4.C.E states, "Vendor must install technology if applicable i.e. handhelds, laptops, software etc." Can a current list detailing all pharmacy vendor technology and equipment be provided?

Answer: Currently the Vendor has supplied a fax machine, if barcode scanners are to be used installation assistance may be required.

- g. Question #5 Regarding Attachment F Itemized Cost Proposal. It is unfortunate that Offerors will take great liberties in interpreting the quantities requested when submitting pricing. To clarify:
  - Is Abilify Maint to be priced for a 300mg or 400mg injection?

Answer: Either or both

• Is Advair Diskus to be priced for 1 Diskus and not 30?

Answer: 1 inhaler

• Is Albuterol MDI to be priced for 1 MDI and not 30?

Answer: 1 inhaler

• Is Flovent HFA to be priced for 1 MDI and not 30?

Answer: 1 inhaler

• Is Invega Sust 234 to be priced for 1 injection(1.5mL) or 1 mL?

Answer: 1 injection (1.5ml)

• Is Suboxone SL strips to be priced for 1 box or 1 strip?

Answer: Per strip or per box – just specify

• Is Symbicort to be priced for 1 inhaler or 1 gram?

Answer: 1 inhaler

• Are Offerors to include their AAC price only in Attachment F for each medication? Or, is the price to reflect the medication AAC and the proposed dispensing fee/other markup?

Answer: It needs to be what ACRJ cost would be (all inclusive)

h. Question #6 - Instead of using Attachment F for the pricing basis, would ACRJ consider removing Attachment F and replacing with your actual pharmacy invoice from August 2022 in an Excel format (medication name and strength along with metric quantity dispensed) and have bidders price that document to allow a better and more accurate comparison of pricing based on actual utilization?

Answer: Attachment F will remain as is. Vendor is welcome to include other information regarding other RX pricing.

i. Question #7 - RFP Page 3 states, "The proposed services should provide a varied and systemic benefit within the scope of the Albemarle Charlottesville Regional Jail's goals and objectives." What are the top three goals and objectives in publishing a solicitation at this time that ACRJ wishes to achieve?

Answer: Some of the goals are: To Ensure timely delivery, cost effectiveness, customer service with relation to building formularies, educating staff, and communication.

j. Question #8 - To best understand the perspective of everyone on the evaluation committee, can you please share the name and title of each person that will be involved in the selection process? Will a final decision be made by the evaluation committee, or will the committee provide a recommendation to a final decision maker? If so, who is the final decision maker regarding an award?
